We have a firm commitment to post 16 education for all and believe in equipping each and every one of our students for the next stage of their education, entrance to full time training or the workforce. To achieve this, the programmes of study we offer are specifically designed to reflect the needs of each individual.

A supportive environment

A team of highly experienced teachers and support staff provide daily academic and career centred support and guidance ensuring that the needs of each student are met. Our long standing relationship with The Priory Academy LSST provides additional subject choices and enrichment activities. The Academy also has excellent links with local higher education partners and the Open University providing essential career path continuity and guidance.





Sixth Form





We value our sixth form students greatly and are proud of the strong sense of mutual cooperation and hard work we share with them, encouraging them to play as full a part as possible in the life of the academy.


Through our vertical pastoral system sixth formers are encouraged to develop skills as peer mentors. Sixth form community sports leaders work with Key Stage 2 students from around the city on a regular basis developing their own leadership skills and promoting our sports specialism. Our prefects develop skills of leadership and management through their weekly duties and our most senior students meet with the Headmaster and the Senior Leadership Team on a regular basis to discuss issues raised by students.

We believe this engenders a much stronger sense of community throughout the Academy and actively encourages mutual support among the

student body.

Each student has a Form Tutor who will meet them on a daily basis and who will quickly get to know them very well. The Form Tutors should be seen as the first link between home and the Academy. All students have a planner which can be used to maintain communication between parents and staff at the Academy. The honour of being named the winning House for the academic year is highly prized among the student body, the staff and the governing committee. The range of activities in which students may participate is extensive. This may be during the Academy day or as part of our newly extended range of enrichment activities which take place at the end of normal lessons. It is our desire that every student is able to make a positive contribution to the House competition wherever their skills and interests lie.

The peer mentoring scheme offers guidance to the younger members of the school whilst developing the mentoring skills of older students and reinforcing the core value of mutual respect. In summary, we offer the opportunities of a large Academy, but each student feels part of a smaller and caring unit.





Beyond the Classroom



In addition to the broad range of academic and vocational qualifications available to students, there is also an extensive range of extra curricular activities. We place great importance on every student being able to find activities which can be enjoyed and celebrated. Army Cadet Force, Duke of Edinburgh Award Scheme, Media club, Web Design, Young Enterprise and more technologically focused work, in keeping with our Specialist Engineering status, are all available to students, taught or lead by specialist full time staff aided by external expertise where appropriate. The Arts have a high profile within the Academy; drama is taught to all students in Key Stage 3 and is available as an option thereafter. A wide range of production opportunities exist for students of all ages as actors, directors and technical crew in Academy productions. Music is also taught to all in Key Stage 3 and is an optional subject thereafter. Students of all ages benefit from excellent opportunities for instrumental and ensemble teaching. We are extremely proud of the standards achieved by our students in the performing arts.

As a Specialist Sport and Health Academy we are able to provide our students with opportunities in an extensive and diverse range of activities. The Priory City of Lincoln Academy has its own sports centre which includes a swimming pool, tennis courts, badminton courts, netball courts, a gymnasium, a fitness suite, a sports hall, a dance studio, two synthetic cricket pitches, extensive playing fields and a large area of woodland. Coaching is available for both boys and girls football, netball, rounders, athletics, swimming, tennis, canoeing, basketball, rugby and many more, the range of activities available is continually being increased. The standard of sport is very high and the Academy can boast a number of national champions among the student body.

Being part of the Priory Federation of Academies provides more opportunities to students which might not be available to a single academy working in isolation. For example, the Federation owns a sizeable residential property in the Normandy region of France, where students will have opportunity to take part in residential visits. These visits will be aimed at broadening cultural appreciation and understanding whilst offering an extended curriculum beyond the Academy itself.
